Slickbar’s new JBF 430 Multi-Purpose Vessel joins SUMED’s arsenal of spill response equipment in Sidi Kerir Terminal Alexandria, Egypt. The JBF 430 is 10m long x 3m wide outfitted with twin 150HP Four Stroke Honda Engines, lighted king posts for night operations and will store 600m of Deployment Boom on the deck. The vessel has been outfitted for future use as an oil recovery, fire fighting and dispersant spraying vessel.
